Hidden Job Markets

Surveys have shown that up to 80% of vacancies are filled by ways other than newspaper advertisements, such as: direct approaches to employers; word of mouth through networks of family and friends; and door-to-door visits.

But what is the Best Way to do it?

- Approach the task in a systematic way
- Try to maintain a positive attitude
- Identify what you can offer an employer first, then thoughtful targeting of employers
- Visit door-to-door for 2-3 hours at a time can be part of an overall planned job hunt

Direct Approaches to Employers

- Many employers of casual staff keep files of resumes or a list of people to contact at short notice
- Approaches can be made by personal visiting, by phone or by letters
- Try places such as sporting and entertainment venues (such as SCG, Sydney Olympic Park), but also smaller places such as bars, restaurants, take-away shops, convenience stores, market research companies etc.

Finding Employers to Approach

- Friends and relatives can often suggest employers, or they can act as your eyes and ears to help find vacancies.
- The Yellow Pages phone directory is also a useful way of finding employers to approach.
- Think about the types of jobs you are after, and then look up the types of businesses that have these jobs in the index. Contact them either in person or by phone.

Best Areas for Door-to-door Visits

Conduct a door-to-door visit of businesses in various areas and leave your resume with them. When you visit them, the employers will be impressed with your enthusiasm in finding a job and they're more likely to offer you a job.

Job Certification

In Australia - jobs in hospitality are certainly the most plentiful and among the best paid, plus you can make tips if you are good. Experience will help, but you must be aware that hospitality employers by law in NSW will require a certificate to certify that you have completed mandatory training such as:

- Responsible Service of Alcohol Course (RSA) (6 hours)
- Responsible Conduct of Gambling (RCG) (6 hours)

Nursing homes also offer plenty of jobs in aged care and offer quite good pay in the weekends and night shifts. You must do the following course to work in an aged care facility as an Assistant in Nursing (AIN):

Certificate II in Aged Care Work (5 weeks)

Similarly, there are plenty of jobs in childcare too. A first aid certificate will help in securing a position as a Childcare Assistant:

• First Aid Training (1 day)

- Tell me a little about yourself.
- What are your strengths? Weaknesses?
- What causes you stress and how do you handle it?
- Give me three adjectives that describe you.
- What do you consider your greatest accomplishment?
- What do you like to do in your spare time?
- Where do you see yourself in five years?
- How do you define success?
- What type of supervision do you prefer?
- How do you feel about working nights and weekends for special events and activities?
- What do you know about our company/organization?
- What do you know about this position?
- Why do you want to work in this field/for our company?
- How did you decide on your career/field/major?
- How would your co-workers/supervisors describe you?
- Give me an example of a time when you had to make an important decision and how you came to that decision.
- Tell me about a time when you had to work with a difficult person and how you handled it.
- Please give me an example where you demonstrated the ability to be an effective member of a team.
- Give me three reasons why I should hire you.
- What did you like the most and the least about your last place of employment?
